
Setting up SELF-HOSTED WORDPRESS

Before you can install WordPress to your website, you need first to be sure that you have successfully connected your domain name to your hosting, as shown back on page 19. If this is done successfully, you will see your hosting company's holding page when you visit your website.

How exactly you install Wordby on your host, but as you will have chose host with a simple install system, it should be easy, and will not be too different too either of the setups pictured below

If your hosting company is Bluehost, the installation process will look something like this (although the interface may change slightly from time to











Summary: WordPress Pluses and Minuses

- +Self-hosted WP (wordpress.org) is FREE, used by 20-40% of all websites
 - + Good for Blogs (started that way)
 - + Lots of on-line help & discussion
 - **±**Tremendous variety of plugins, themes
 - + Mobile-friendly ("responsive") themes
 - + Written in PHP (custom plugins are easy)
- Nobody "owns" wordpress.org
 - Security is YOUR responsibility (pick the right plugins, avoid the wrong ones, because hacking is frequent)
 - No "Help" chat room, etc
 - Constantly in flux beware auto updates!

- Opinion: No Free Lunch
 - All website builders require a learning period
 - Squarespace: 7.1 vs 7.0 inconsistencies
 - Wix: not that intuitive
 - Drupal: powerful, tough to learn
 - "Better the devil you know"
 - Freedom <===> Responsibility
 - NOT FOR SISSIES!
